before the coming of the Lord’s great and glorious day.

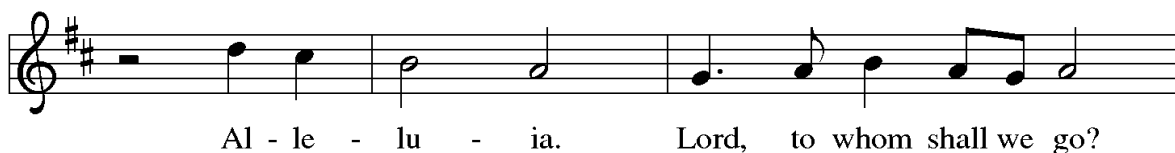
