Dear Beloved,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our risen and ascended Lord, Jesus the Christ!

We cannot thank you enough for your overwhelming expressions of love and prayer in these past three months. Your phone calls to one another, cards sent, Zoom meeting check-ins, visits to wave outside one another's windows have connected us and grafted us together as God's people at Holy Trinity in ways never before seen. We thank you for your support for us, your pastors, for your gratitude shared with our gifted staff, and your generosity in your offerings and gifts to the Amazing Love Campaign!

We have been working over the past several weeks to plan for a staged re-opening of our building and facilities as we continue to find "new ways" to be the church during this pandemic of the novel coronavirus Covid-19. Until there is a widely-used vaccine, we will need to continue to live in a "new normal" for the welfare of all.

We want you to know that we are moving with intentional caution out of an abundance of love for our members, staff, guests, and partners alike. Our pace may feel too slow for you, and so we want you to know it is because we want to keep you safe, and because many of our community members may find themselves in the "vulnerable" category when it comes to the virus.

With that in mind you will find in this publication a "staged" reopening plan. A more detailed "safety plan" is on file in the church office complete with our "physical distancing" and sanitation practices. Our five-staged plan will at times mirror New York State's own "phased" plan of re-entry, though you will observe we are moving at our own pace.

We want to share that even when we do gather for worship in person, it will not be going back to the "old normal" rather it will be a "new normal" until the vaccine is widely available. Based on information from epidemiologists, and other medical and scientific data, we are not able to participate in congregational singing or choral music at this time. The act of "projecting" while singing, and even while speaking, has been noted to be a source of "super spreading" of the water droplets which carry the virus from a person who has Covid-19, even if they are asymptomatic.



Holy Communion will be celebrated upon the return of in-person worship, but it will be done through a contact-less means. Other changes in how we "do" worship will also be evident.

Throughout our re-opening stages, we will continue to worship via Live-Stream at holytrinitybuffalo.org and shared on Facebook so that everyone can still have access to our worship experiences from the comfort of their home.

We will continue to find creative ways to gather on-line and in-person as each stage allows us, and give thanks for the ways technology can make this possible. We will also continue to connect via phone calls, mail, and digital means throughout this time. Even when we cannot gather together – we are not alone; you are not alone.

If you are in need of some pastoral counseling or conversation, please call the church office and appropriate appointments may be made. Beginning with Stage 2 of our reopening plan there is a staff person in the church office Monday to Friday and phone calls and emails will be answered as quickly as possible.

We thank you again for your support; and we give thanks for the ways God has bound us to Godself, and one another.

A Word from Pastor Brenda

Y'all, I'm tired. I'm exhausted. This has been hard. And I'm not just talking about being under shut-down orders from the state and county to mitigate the spread of coronavirus. Yes, that's hard, to be sequestered from family and friends, to be alone without physical proximity to community and support networks that we so heavily rely on. I'm exhausted that human interaction has been stripped down to that of digital means, where family dinners now happen over high-speed internet connections and celebrations happen behind the safety of a mask.

Don't get me wrong, I'm not advocating the lessening of these restrictions. These restrictions have been and continue to be paramount to curbing the spread of coronavirus and to flattening the curve so that we can un-pause and move forward into a new normal that we will all be figuring out, together; with the key word being TOGETHER. We do these safety restrictions out of love for one another, by staying home, staying separated, wearing a mask we are protecting those we love as well as those we don't. We've been given the directive to love one another as God has loved us, without regard of anything. Simple, to love one another. And if that means staying home, washing my hands, and wearing a mask then so be it, that's what I'll do. It's a simple gesture to show that I care and value you as a beloved child of God. As Courtney Ariel wrote in our article "For Our White Friends Desiring to be Allies," "You are lovely, human, and amazing."

And yet, in the midst of the fear and uncertainty of living through a global pandemic, I can still only imagine what it feels like to be living in this world as many of my siblings in Christ formed in brown and black bodies feel. I can only imagine what it feels like to live in this world as many of siblings in Christ who identify as LGBTQIA+ live or try to live as their true authentic selves. Living in fear of what is happening outside of my own home and whether or not I might contract a virus that could mean life or death is only a fraction of the fear that these, my siblings in Christ, live with each and every day, from before the pandemic of coronavirus to long after it.

In the past few weeks' we have witnessed the murder of two of our African American siblings in Christ, Ahmaud Arbery and George Floyd. I say their names. I have heard the laments of friends of mine who fear each and everyday of what might happen to them when they leave their homes or of how they can raise their young, black sons in this world with the constant fear that this will not change in their lifetime or their child's and to have to teach them how to survive in this world, in this world that only sees the color of their skin and makes rash, quick judgment calls that seem to often than not to end in death for those black and brown bodies, those black and brown sons.

I mourn with my siblings, I grieve with my siblings, I am exhausted alongside my siblings, and yet, my exhaustion, my mourning, my grief is incomparable to the grief, mourning, and exhaustion they feel as targets of discrimination and racism. Of being condemned to a life ruled by injustices and oppression.

I am reminded of the book written by Dr. Seuss, *The Sneetches*. I have preached on this book before, on the way we are taught to discriminate, to label things as same or different and inherently as good and bad.

From my sermon, preached May 2016:

"For God see our differences as valuable and enriching for relationships in community. For God so loved the world, the whole word, differences and all, that God sent Jesus so that the world may not perish but have eternal life."

The lectionary that day included the letter to the Galatians 3:26-28; "²⁶ for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. ²⁷ As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. ²⁸ There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus."

And while this is what we long for, this is what I know the table will be like when we are once and for all gathered around for that great heavenly banquet. Today we weep, today we cry out in lament for those who suffer at the hands of systemic injustices and oppression, who are not seen as truly human just because of the color of their skin or for who they love. We cry out, "how long O, Lord?"

Where Do Cashews Come From?

Can you point out Gambia on a map? It is a small West-African country and the Lutheran Church there is supported by ELCA World Hunger. Marie Mendy grows cashews there, but found the income from her farm unreliable. The Gambian Church works for gender equality, and encourages women to be self-reliant, economically independent, and confident when facing difficult situations. It got a land donation where the women could expand their crops, and as they sold their cashews, they bought more land to expand further. This ensures a sustainable cash flow source for the women year 'round, as the harvest includes more than the nuts themselves: the women also make juice, jam, soap and fertilizer. So now Marie Mendy can feed her family and pay her grandchildren's school fees, clothing, and medical care. This program also helped six more communities in 2019, and has provided the women with consistent livelihoods, and business and marketing skills. Their future is much brighter, and the benefits from their work will be felt for generations to come.



Also 2020 is the year of the United States Census. Jesus Christ, the Savior of The World was born during a census.


Lastly, 2020 is perfect vision. May our sight focus on The Lord and living according to His perfect vision for us knowing He holds us in the palm of His hand.
