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#### About Julie Tunstall

Julie Tunstall, *flutist*, a native of Portland OR, is a musician of very diverse talents. She has attended Holy Trinity Lutheran Church and has sung in the choir since she and her husband, French Hornist John Georger, moved to the area in 2008. A graduate of Portland State University, she played flute in the Portland Youth Philharmonic and the Portland Opera Orchestra, and sang with the Oregon Symphony Chorus and Pops singers and several other vocal and instrumental groups. Moving across the country, she sang Beethoven's 9th Symphony with the Boston Symphony, and also sang with groups such as Rochester Philharmonic and the Syracuse Opera. She has also played flute and piccolo with many groups such as the Anchorage Symphony and Opera, Erie Philharmonic, Binghamton Symphony, and Buffalo Philharmonic and is currently Principal Flute with the Southern Tier Symphony, a professional Orchestra based in Olean NY. After moving to New York, she was able to complete a master's and doctorate in flute performance, and won the Curtis Peck teaching award for her work in Aural Skills. She has taught at several colleges in WNY including Syracuse, Eastman, Houghton, University of Pittsburgh at Bradford, Alfred, Jamestown Community College and Niagara University, and has also taught in public school music programs. Another highlight has been performing flute and piano literature with Laura Peterson, professor at St. Bonaventure University. Privately, she has taught flute, piano, voice, jazz, guitar and Suzuki strings for groups such as Buffalo String Works, and she continues to teach privately from her home.

Julie and John met when she was a professor at Houghton College and he was the band director at nearby Fillmore Central School. They married in 2002 at Shepherd of the Valley ELCA Lutheran Church in Wellsville New York, where they participated in the music ministry. While in the area, Julie founded a NYSCA funded chamber music series in Wellsville, a professional Orchestra in Olean, and served as president of the Allegany Arts Association. In addition to performing and teaching, Julie enjoys ballet, skiing, bicycling, reading, hugging cats, and hiking. Last year she completed 750 miles of the Appalachian Trail, and has climbed 15 of the 46 peaks over 4000 feet in the Adirondack High Peak Region. John and Julie continue to play in the Southern Tier Symphony, and have performed with many local music groups well. Their daughter Emily lives with her husband, Elias Velasquez, in Portland OR. They officially joined Holy Trinity church in December 2019, happy to join their faith with excellence in music worship.

SIDEWALK CHALK SUNDAY! A chance to gather together - with physical distancing in mind - and spread some love and positivity in our City. Confirmation Class is designed for students who are entering 7th and 8th grades. Please contact Pastor Brenda with any questions you may have.

OUTDOOR SERVICE: A Service of Holy Communion will be held outdoors on Sunday, August 30 at 12noon. Worshippers will be encouraged to bring their own lawn chairs, while folding chairs will be available for those who are not able to bring their own. Chairs will be placed a minimum of 6-8 feet apart from one another at designated pre-marked spaces. Face coverings will be required in addition to other safety protocols in place. LYO FUNDRAISER: Flocking season is here! How it works: Place an order for a flock of flamingos to be sent to your friend's yard. Volunteers will be sent out to covertly flock the yard. The flamingos will roost on the lawn for a week when they will mysteriously migrate to another friend's lawn. The "flockee" will have the opportunity to select the flock's next migration location, for a reasonable donation. If you are not interested in having our fine pink feathered friends make a trip to your yard, you can purchase Anti-Flocking Insurance. This will guarantee the flamingos fly past your yard and flock at a different home. The flamingos will only be in the Buffalo area for a short time, from July-Sept so catch them before they continue on their migratory path. All proceeds of this Fundraiser will go to support the LYO Mission Fund. You can find the order forms in the church newsletter. Flocking Fees are \$20 for migration location, \$25 for Anti-Flocking Insurance and \$15 for early-herding and transportation of flock.
