At the cross, you watered us from Jesus' wounded side, and on this day, you shower us again with the water of life.


We praise you for your salvation through water, for the water in this font, and for all water everywhere.



Music Notes

Tenor Kyle van Schoonhoven is a recent graduate of the world-renowned Adler Fellowship at the San Francisco Opera. In 2017, van Schoonhoven was named a winner of the prestigious Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions. Additionally, he was the recipient of a 2018 Sara Tucker Study Grant, received the Nicolai Gedda Memorial Award from the prestigious George London Foundation, was awarded the top prize in the Brava! Opera Theater and James M. Collier Young Artist Program Vocal Competition and was a finalist in the 2016 Jensen Foundation Voice Competition. His performance credits include principal-role appearances with the Cincinnati Opera, San Francisco Opera, New York Lyric Opera, Manhattan Opera Studio, Boston Youth Symphony Orchestra, and our own Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra. Mr. van Schoonhoven holds degrees from the Fredonia School of Music and Westminster Choir College, and is a native of Lockport, NY.

Rienzi is an early opera by Richard Wagner in five acts, with the libretto written by the composer after Edward Bulwer-Lytton's novel of the same name. It was first performed in 1842 in Dresden and was the composer's first success.

Music Notes Cont.

The opera is set in Rome and is based on the life of Cola di Rienzi (1313–1354), a late medieval Italian populist figure who succeeds in outwitting and then defeating the nobles and their followers and in raising the power of the people. Magnanimous at first, he is forced by events to crush the nobles' rebellion against the people's power, but popular opinion changes and even the Church, which had urged him to assert himself, turns against him. In the end the populace burns the Capitol, in which Rienzi and a few adherents have made a last stand.

The music you will hear during the sermon meditation is an orchestral transcription of the instrumental interlude that begins Act V. Following the peace, we will hear Rienzi's prayer, "Allmächt'ger Vater" (Almighty Father!), which follows the orchestral interlude in Act V.
