Often the first step to change is listening. We have to listen to those we've hurt. We have to listen to creation as she cries. We have to listen to the voice of the oppressed, if we ever hope to make things right.

So today as we begin our prayer of confession, we will start with a moment of silence – a moment to listen. And then we will pray together trusting that God is always listening to us, and that God's ears listen with love.
