

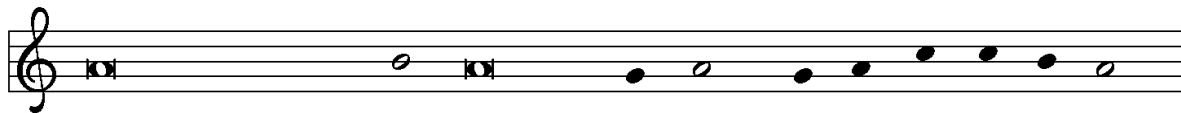

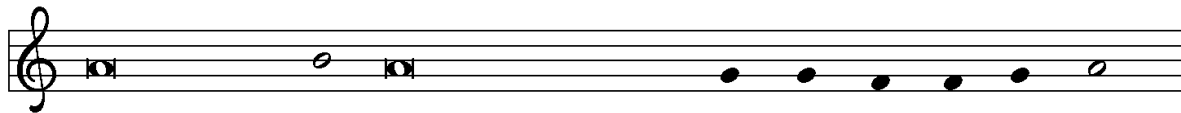

The first reading for the Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost is recorded in Deuteronomy, the 4th Chapter.

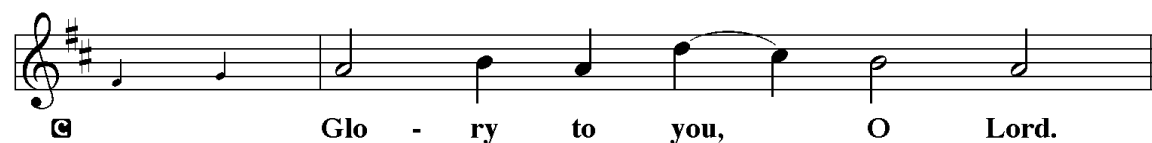

¹Now when the Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around [Jesus], ²they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them.

³(For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders; ⁴and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it; and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.) ⁵So the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, “Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?” ⁶He said to them, “Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written,

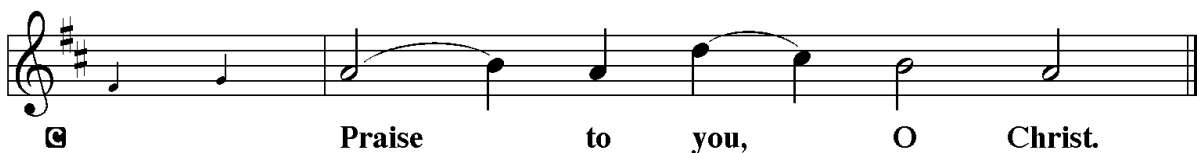
‘This people honors me with their lips,

Music Notes

Dutch composer Ad Wammes's (b. 1953) eclectic musical background includes formal studies at the Utrecht and Rotterdam conservatories with leading Dutch composers (including Ton de Leeuw), years as the keyboardist in the rock group Finch, and composition of numerous works for concert, television, and film. In the 1980s, he wrote the music for several Dutch *Sesame Street* albums and composed many works for Dutch television. In recent years, he has focused more on concert music, and his organ music has found particularly wide acclaim. His organ piece *Miroir* has quickly become one of the most played contemporary works for the instrument. The success of this work has been followed with many commissions from the world's leading organ performers.
