INTRODUCTION

Three weeks ago we heard Peter's confession of faith as told in John's gospel. This week we hear Mark's version, when Peter says, "You are the Messiah." In John, the stumbling block is Jesus' invitation to eat his flesh, given for the life of the world. In Mark too the scandal has to do with Jesus' words about his own coming death, and here Peter himself stumbles over Jesus' words. But Jesus is anointed (the meaning of messiah) in Mark only on the way to the cross (14:3); so we are anointed in baptism with the sign of the cross.

Music Notes

Robert J. Powell was born 1932, in Benoit, Mississippi. He earned his Bachelor of Music in Organ and Composition from Louisiana State University and his Master of Sacred Music from Union Theological Seminary School of Sacred Music, New York. Mr. Powell has approximately 300 works in print for choral, solo, organ, handbells, and instrumental ensembles in major American and English church music publishers. He has held positions as the Assistant Organist at The Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York from 1958-1960, Organist/Choir Director at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Meridian, 1960-1965, Director of Music Mississippi from Organist/Choirmaster at St. Paul's School in Concord, New Hampshire from 1965-1968, Director of Music and Organist/Choirmaster at Christ Church in Greenville, South Carolina from 1968-2003, and Organist at Trinity United Methodist Church in Greenville, South Carolina in 2003.

American Tribute was commissioned in 2006 for the Churches of St. John the Evangelist and of St. Joseph, Rensselaer, NY. Director of Music David A. Vredenburg says:

"The sense of patriotism in each congregation runs high. I have always been moved by our nation's ideals, but am one whose patriotism has been tinged by a keen awareness of the fallen nature of many of our prideful human endeavors, the tragedy of all military conflict, and the offense of dividing up God's creation into warring parties."
