COMMUNITY OF GOOD NEIGHBORS FOOD COLLECTION:

During October, Thrivent Financial is helping members combat food insecurity in communities across the region with the Feed Northeast 2021 Thrivent Action Team Incentive program. You can be a part of it! Linda Schmidt, as a member of HT, has received a Thrivent grant of \$250 to get the drive going. She is asking you, as a member or friend of HT, to also support this incentive by bringing food to church through October 31st. If our collection reaches a minimum of 500 items for donation to a local food pantry, Community of Good Neighbors could be eligible to receive an additional \$500 from Thrivent.
