Rest in this promise:

If we get lost, we will be found. If we mess up, we are forgiven. If we withhold love, God is lavish in loving us. We are claimed. We are loved. We are forgiven. Thanks be to God. Amen.

⁷Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."



BENEDICTION


