A Message from the Pastor

I just started a fascinating book by Frederick Buechner, who is one of the first to help me see through the scrim on which most of life is played out and discover a deeper dimension. It's called *The Remarkable Ordinary: How to Stop, Look, and Listen to Life*, and it's based on some of his mostly unpublished lectures which seem as fresh today as when they were written in the 1980s.

Buechner described an experiment that took place when he was a student at Princeton. Students would peer into a room through a small hole, looking for what they were told to look for – the position of a certain object, for example – and then answer questions about what they saw. Then the students would be asked, “Did you see anything else?” and mostly they said, “No, we didn’t.” Buechner described the room as a “crazy room” – the angles were off, one wall was higher than another, the floor was unlevel, and so on. Then Buechner observed, “the students didn’t see any of that because they hadn’t been told to expect to see that.”

It's an idea attributed to several sources – Anaïs Nin, Immanuel Kant, the Babylonian Talmud, and others – so it has stood the test of time, and I take it to be true. It goes something like this: we don't see things as they are, we see things as we are. We project our inner reality onto life's canvas and take it to be the way things are; we see what we expect. If instead we want to see life as it is and deal with it on its terms, we need to let go of what we believe we see and learn to see what is really there to be seen.

Which brings me to the interim time for a congregation, that curious and challenging season after one pastor departs when the search is made for the next pastor. It's a season of farewells, and self-study, and describing the future, and identifying goals and expectations, and a lot more. Then there's the identification and calling of a pastor whom the congregation believes will meet its expectations – identifying the pastor and future they're looking for.

The biggest challenge may be for the congregation not only to keep alert for what they're looking for but to also see what they haven't been told to look for, what they don't know to look for, what they may never have recognized as a possibility. And here's where reframing helps. When the search doesn't go as expected or takes longer than expected, instead of asking “What are we doing wrong” or “What's wrong with the system?” it may be more helpful to ask, “What is this teaching us?” “What are we learning?” “What new possibilities is this experience opening up for us?” “What deeper dimension of our experience is right in front of us but we haven't yet seen because we haven't been told to look for it?” Farm fields are enriched during fallow seasons. So are congregations during seasons of waiting.

Important Information:

Order Early: The best way to avoid shortages is to turn in your order form as soon as possible. Order forms can be turned into the office at any time and they will be picked up every Sunday. The earlier orders are collected the earlier they can be processed.

Shortages: Any unforeseen shortages will be refunded only. Notification and refunds will be made as soon as possible so that you can make other arrangements to purchase your plants.

Hanging Baskets: These sell out quickly. In order to give the best possible chance to get the hanging basket choices that you have we urge you to turn in any orders with hanging baskets **AS SOON AS POSSIBLE**. In an attempt to minimize shortages, Hanging basket orders will be called in periodically as orders come in.

Plants: Available in full flats only. **NO HALF FLATS. NO MIXING OF COLORS. NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Geraniums: Order by the box (One dozen per box). NO MIXING OF COLORS. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Herbs: Order by the box in groups of 3 (18 per box). These may be mixed.

Late Orders: We will do our best to process late orders received between March 27 and April 15. However, there should be no assumption that your entire order will be fulfilled.

Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief



This year, during the Lenten Season, members and friends of Holy Trinity are invited to participate in the collection of items for Personal Care Kits as needed by Lutheran World Relief. These kits will then be sent through LWR to countries in need and those living in crisis. Items may be brought to church from February 22nd through April 1st and placed on the table at Kahler's Korner located near the church office. We will be collecting completed kits, donations of items for the kits or funds to purchase the items. Monetary donations may be put in an envelope and marked for "LWR Personal Care Kits Project" and placed in the offering plate or sent to the church office. There will be a compilation event following a 10:30 worship service shortly after Easter in Redeemer Hall.

Each kit contains:

- 1 lightweight bath towel (between 20"x40" & 52"x27')
- 2-3 bath size bars of soap
- 1 adult size toothbrush
- 1 sturdy comb
- 1 metal nail clippers

Because each kit must contain the specific items listed, we are asking that you purchase the correct number of items to complete a kit rather than a large amount of one item.

CGN(Community of Good Neighbors) MOBILE FOOD PANTRY UPDATE: The need for healthy food and especially fresh produce continues. Through Holy Trinity's partnership with CGN there are **several ways we can help in this mission outreach to our East Buffalo neighbors** and help Pr. Kwame Pitts provide an entryway to eradicate food disparity and build relationships which reflect the Kingdom of God in loving action.

1. Monetary donations given directly to Holy Trinity and designated specifically for the Food Pantry support. HT Members, Linda and Dave Schmidt, using those donations, are then able to purchase 4-5 cases of such items as sweet potatoes, zucchini, onions, bananas, and oranges, among others, directly from Sunset Fruits and Vegetables on Bailey Ave. These items are then distributed on the First and Third Thursday of each month at CGN Mobile Pantry Van's current site 21 Doat St. right next to Jericho Road Community Health Center.

2. Monetary Donations sent directly for CGN to ELCA via the Web site. Those gifts can then be used to offset any financial needs. For example, Buying gas, paying Motor Vehicle Dept. fees to register the Pantry Bus, purchasing shelving to hold the food items. Pr. Kwame can request those funds as needed. (**See guidelines below for this option)

3. Food Donations: The following items are requested and we are asked to provide **only these**. Other items are either fully stocked or not as needed or beneficial as these. **Breakfast food:** Cold and Hot Cereals **Rice:** Small bags 1 or 2 lb., **Pasta with Sauce,** **BEANS:** Canned or dried. **MEATS:** tuna or chicken, **Canned fruits** **PLEASE CHECK DATES** Expired items must not be distributed.

4. Volunteers: 10 am on the First and Third Thursday of the month. The Mobile Food Pantry sets up next to Jericho Road Community Health Center at 21 Doat St. off Genesee St. We stay until the food is gone (generally only 1 hour.) We help with welcoming and assisting in any way needed. **Monday mornings from 9am-11am and Wednesdays from 12pm-2pm at the Office.** Location is 1092 Main right next to HT. These times are for organizing and setting up the non-perishables for Pantry Days.

5. Winter Clothing Distribution: We continue to collect items of winter clothing for distribution through the CGN Mobile Food Pantry. This will become a stronger outreach in the coming months as CGN transfers from the van to the renovated Bus. **Items needed:** Hats, scarves, gloves/mittens and heavy socks As Spring approaches these items will go on sale, so look for those clearance racks and make your money go farther.
