#### INTRODUCTION AND WELCOME



P: This is the day in which all who believe in Christ

C: are rescued from evil and the gloom of sin.

P: This is the day in which, breaking the chains of death,

C: Christ arises from hell in triumph.

P: For it would have profited us nothing to be born

C: had we not also been redeemed.

P: Oh, how wonderful the condescension of your loving kindness! Oh, how inestimable the goodness of your love,

C: that to redeem a slave you delivered up your Son!

P: O necessary sin of Adam that is wiped away by the death of Christ!

C: O happy fault that was worthy to have so great a Redeemer!

P: The holiness of this time puts to flight the deeds of wickedness;

C: washes away sin;

P: restores innocence to the fallen,

C: and joy to those who mourn;

P: casts out hate;

C: brings peace; and humbles earthly pride.

P: Therefore, on this day of grace, receive, O holy God, this morning sacrifice of praise; which the Church lays before you in the solemn offering of the candle.

C: We sing the glories of this flame, the brightness of which is not diminished, even when its light is divided and borrowed.

P: We, therefore, pray to you, O Lord, that this candle, burning to the honor of your name, will continue to vanquish the evil of our time and be mingled with the lights of heaven.

<sup>1</sup>Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. <sup>2</sup>So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." <sup>3</sup>Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb.

As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; <sup>12</sup>and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. <sup>13</sup>They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." 14When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. <sup>15</sup>Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." <sup>16</sup>Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). <sup>17</sup>Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" <sup>18</sup>Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.



To you, O God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory in your holy church, now and forever. **Amen.** 


