## FIRST READING: Acts 7:55-60

The first reading for the Fifth Sunday of Easter is recorded in Acts, the 7<sup>th</sup> Chapter.

<sup>55</sup>Filled with the Holy Spirit, [Stephen] gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. <sup>56</sup>"Look," he said, "I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!" <sup>57</sup>But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. <sup>58</sup>Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. <sup>59</sup>While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." <sup>60</sup>Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." 

#### NICENE CREED





The sacrament of Holy Baptism has several parts which together constitute the fullness of the sacrament of initiation into the community of faith: presentation, thanksgiving, renunciation, profession of faith, baptism with water, laying on of hands and signation, and welcome into the congregation. Today we welcome into the Lord's family and into our fellowship in the gospel: William Carrick, son of Charles and Aurora Deeds.

#### Music Notes

J. S. Bach's *Erbarm dich mein* (Have mercy on me) is based on an early, and now largely forgotten, hymn tune for the text of Psalm 51. With that Psalm's lament of the penitent's sin coupled with the pleading pulse of the music, this work is often fittingly heard during Lent. Written around 1704, it is a uniquely simple piece in the Bach catalog with no intricate counterpoint or other typical Bach flourishes. It is so different when compared to his other works that the great Bach scholar, Albert Schweitzer, once suggested that Bach could never have written it, yet there is evidence indicating that he was, indeed, the composer.

In the early 1950s English composer and conductor **Eric Coates** (1886-1957) had written as an exercise for himself a march in the style of Elgar's *Pomp and Circumstance* marches. Shortly after its completion he was approached by the producers of the film, *The Dam Busters*, to write music for that project. Coates ended up submitting his recently completed – and unnamed – Elgar-like march to the film, resulting in it becoming known as *The Dam Busters March*. John Barnard (b. 1948) later arranged the march's theme as a hymn, setting it to the text of Psalm 46, "God is our strength and refuge, our present help in trouble" and it appears in some hymnals, though not our ELW.

I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life was written for the University at Virginia Singers by composer-conductor Michael Slon. A Buffalo native, Dr. Slon attended the St. Joseph Collegiate Institute. He currently serves as Director of Choral Music and associate professor at the University of Virginia where he leads the University Singers, UVA Chamber Singers and guest conducts the Charlottesville Symphony. He also serves as Music Director of the Oratorio Society of Virginia. Dr. Slon is a graduate of Cornell University and the Jacobs School of Music - Indiana University.

The English Anthem *O Taste and See* was composed by Ralph Vaughan Williams for the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in Westminster Abbey, Tuesday, June 2, 1953. We present it in honor of the coronation of King Charles III.
