


²⁹"Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word;

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.



Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, almighty God, now and for ever. **Amen.**


THE LORD'S PRAYER

Invitation to Communion

Receiving the wafer in your hand, you are invited to dip or "intinct" the wafer into the chalice. There is wine in the silver chalice and grape juice in the ceramic chalice. For those who prefer, gluten-free wafers are available by simply asking the Pastor as you are served. Portable communion cups are also available for those who are not comfortable sharing the sacrament of Holy Communion in-person. Adults or children choosing not to receive communion may come forward to receive a blessing. The Pastors will bring the sacrament to persons in the pews that are unable to come forward. Please advise an usher if you wish the pastor to do so.

The body and blood of our Sovereign and Savior Jesus Christ strengthen you and keep you in His grace.

TRANSITION CONTINUES ON JANUARY 13, AND IT'S BIGGER THAN YOU THINK! — Our transition season at Holy Trinity was not complete when Pastor Jeff arrived in November. When God said to Israel, "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" (Isa. 43:19), there was more on the horizon than a new administration. The world had changed, and so must Israel's way of life. They would rebuild upon ancient foundations, but the building would have a new look for a new day.
