## THE FIRST READING: Isaiah 6:1-13

The first reading for the Fifth Sunday after Epiphany is recorded in Isaiah, the 6<sup>th</sup> Chapter.

<sup>1</sup> In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty, and the hem of his robe filled the temple. <sup>2</sup> Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. <sup>3</sup> And one called to another and said,

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory."

<sup>4</sup> The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. <sup>5</sup> And I said, "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

<sup>6</sup> Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. <sup>7</sup> The seraph touched my mouth with it and said, "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." <sup>8</sup> Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!" <sup>9</sup> And he said, "Go and say to this people:

'Keep listening, but do not comprehend; keep looking, but do not understand.' <sup>10</sup> Make the mind of this people dull, and stop their ears, and shut their eyes, so that they may not look with their eyes and listen with their ears and comprehend with their minds and turn and be healed." <sup>11</sup> Then I said, "How long, O Lord?" And he said, "Until cities lie waste without inhabitant, and houses without people, and the land is utterly desolate; <sup>12</sup> until the Lord sends everyone far away, and vast is the emptiness in the midst of the land. <sup>13</sup> Even if a tenth part remain in it, it will be burned again, like a terebinth or an oak whose stump remains standing when it is felled." The holy seed is its stump.

## **SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11**

The second reading for today is recorded in 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians, the 15<sup>th</sup> Chapter.

<sup>1</sup>Now I want you to understand, brothers and sisters, the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, <sup>2</sup> through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you—unless you have come to believe in vain.

<sup>3</sup> For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures <sup>4</sup> and that he was buried and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures <sup>5</sup> and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. <sup>6</sup> Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. <sup>7</sup> Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. <sup>8</sup> Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. <sup>9</sup> For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. <sup>10</sup> But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain.



And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. <sup>8</sup> But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus's knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" <sup>9</sup> For he and all who were with him were astounded at the catch of fish that they had taken, <sup>10</sup> and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." <sup>11</sup> When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.





## **Music Notes**

This February, Holy Trinity will highlight African American composers in honor of black history month.

Sometimes I Feel Like a Motherless Child is a traditional spiritual. It dates back to the era of slavery in the United States.

We hear tenor Riley Nahlik sing Harry T. Burleigh's setting of that music. Harry T. Burleigh (1866–1949) was an American classical composer, arranger, and professional singer known for his baritone voice. Originally from Erie, PA, Burleigh was the first black composer who was instrumental in developing characteristically "American music;" he made black music available to classically trained artists by introducing them to spirituals and by arranging spirituals in a more classical form.

The organ prelude is also based on the spiritual *Sometimes I Feel Like a Motherless child*. Iain Farrington (b. 1977) is a British pianist, organist, composer and arranger. He performs regularly with some of the country's leading singers, instrumentalists and choirs, as well as giving solo recitals.

The Chancel Choir Treble Voices sing a beautiful piece called *I Hear Music in the Air* based on the spirituals *I Will Trust in the Lord* and *Up Above My Head*. Carl Maultsby is an African-American composer, arranger, conductor, organist, keyboardist, singer, and author. Carl MaultsBy is a diverse composer working in musical theatre, film, television, records, and cultural media.

Riley Nahlik also sings the art song *Because* by Florence Price. Florence Beatrice Price (1887-1953) was an American classical composer, pianist, organist and music teacher. Born in Little Rock, Arkansas, Price was educated at the New England Conservatory of Music, and was active in Chicago from 1927 until her death in 1953. Price is noted as the first African-American woman to be recognized as a symphonic composer, and the first to have a composition played by a major American symphony orchestra.

The organ postlude is *Fanfare and Chorale* by Calvin Fuller. He is currently the organist/ choirmaster at St. James Episcopal Church in Houston and adjunct professor at Texas Southern University. Fuller is the chorus master for the Houston Ebony Opera Guild and Opera in the Heights.




