

The second reading for today is recorded in 1st Corinthians, the 15th Chapter.

¹² Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³ If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised, ¹⁴ and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation is in vain and your faith is in vain. ¹⁵ We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. ¹⁶ For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. ¹⁷ If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile, and you are still in your sins. ¹⁸ Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. ¹⁹ If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

NICENE CREED



Music Notes

This February, Holy Trinity will highlight African American composers in honor of black history month.

The chancel choir revisits the music of Undine Smith Moore with her setting the spiritual *I Believe This is Jesus*. **Undine Smith Moore** (1904 –1989), the "Dean of Black Women Composers", was an American composer and professor of music in the twentieth century. Moore was originally trained as a classical pianist, but developed a compositional output of mostly vocal music—her preferred genre. Much of her work was inspired by black spirituals and folk music.

The organ postlude *Jubilate* was composed by Nigerian born composer **Fela Sowande.** (1905 –1987) Sowande later studied and lived in London, and eventually settled in the United States. He became a US citizen in 1977. He was granted many honorifics in his lifetime, including Member of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, as well as Member of the British Empire. Although his compositions owe much to a strong Nigerian influence, he also incorporated Western techniques; in this way, he emphasized his belief that nationalism should not go unchecked, but always be part of a great global community.






