



A WORD FOR THE CHILDREN

THE FIRST READING: Acts 16:16-34

The first reading for the Ascension of Our Lord is recorded in Acts, the 16th Chapter.

¹⁶One day as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a female slave who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. ¹⁷While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you the way of salvation." ¹⁸She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour.

¹⁹But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. ²⁰When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men, these Jews, are disturbing our city ²¹ and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us, being Romans, to adopt or observe." ²²The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods.

²³ After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. ²⁴ Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.

²⁵About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. ²⁶ Suddenly there was an earthquake so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken, and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. 27 When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. ²⁸But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." 29 The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. ³⁰Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" 31 They answered, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." 32 They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. 33 At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. 34He brought them up into the house and set food before them, and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.

15 I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason ¹⁶ I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers, ¹⁷ that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, ¹⁸ so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may perceive what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, ¹⁹ and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. ²⁰ God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, ²¹ far above all rule and authority and power and dominion and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. ²² And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, ²³ which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.







The Schober Harpsichord in the church is a gift to the glory of God given by the late Jeanette and Roy Kuck and by Mary Kaufmann.

Dietrich Buxtehude (1637/39 – 1707) was a Danish-German organist and composer. For the last forty years of his life he worked in Lübeck, where he was organist at the large Mariairche. Buxtehude was the greatest composer of the northern European Baroque in the period between Heinrich Schütz and J.S. Bach. His fame as an organist was very considerable. Johann Sebastian Bach walked all the way from Arnstadt to Lübeck to study with Buxtehude, and was crucially influenced by his meeting with the older composer, as was Händel.

The Ascension Cantata "Du Lebensfürst, Herr Jesu Christ", BuxWV 22 is based on five verses of the hymn of thanksgiving of the same name by Johann Rist (1641), and in formal terms, is in the genre of a *Concerto cum aria*. An introductory sonata is followed by verse and ritornello in alternation. A special feature of the scoring is the use of the violetta as a string instrument in the middle of the five-part string texture. This can be played by a modern viola.

The cantata is based on the first, second, fifth, thirteenth, and fourteenth verses of the hymn of thanksgiving "Du Lebensfürst, Herr Jesu Christ" (O prince of life, Lord Jesus Christ) by Johann Rist. It was first published in 1641 in Lüneburg, as part of the first of five volumes of Himmlische Lieder (heavenly songs) with texts by Johann Rist and music by Johann Schop.

According to the subtitle, the song is about the "fröhliche Himmelfahrt [...] Jesu Christi" (joyful Ascension of Jesus Christ) and is thus associated, liturgically speaking, with this Ascension Sunday. Rist's text drew from the twenty-third prayer of the Paradiesgärtlein II (little garden of paradise) by Johann Arndt (1555–1621), which served as the source of many Ascension songs during the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries.

Johann Rist was born in 1607 in Ottensen, Germany; following his studies at Rostock and Rinteln universities, he was appointed Lutheran pastor in Wedel (near Hamburg) in 1635, where he lived until his death in 1667. He is regarded as one of the most important poets of the seventeenth century.

In his cantata, Buxtehude draws from the concerto cum aria form. The introductory Sonata, which mirrors the text's emotional content, is followed by verse 1, a section in concertante style. The subsequent verses 2 to 4 are set as arias. A ritornello links verses 2 and 3 as well as verses 4 and 5 with one another. Verse 5 resumes the concertante style from verse 1 and concludes with an "Allelujah." The different time signatures – 3/2 time in verses 1 and 5 and common time in the aria sections and ritornello – illustrate the work's symmetry and enhance its cantata-like character.
